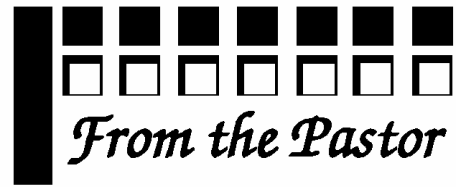

2005 MISSION COOPERATIVE APPEAL

The Propagation of the Faith Office of our diocese has invited the diocese of Kumbakonam, India to speak to us about their missionary activities and challenges. Accordingly, Rev. Peter M. Manickam will be speaking to us during all the Masses on the weekend of August 6th and 7th. This diocese has an area of 5,100 square miles and is situated in Madras State, South India. They have a Catholic population of 212,000 which is just 5½% of the total population. The Kumbakonam diocese is served by 155 diocesan and 38 religious priests and by 17 trained lay catechists. The diocese celebrated the centenary of its inception in 1999 by setting certain concrete and meaningful goals such as:

1. Constructing 10 new parishes, each with a church and a rectory. At present, there are 80 parishes and 530 mission stations. Many of these are so large that they have to be made independent parishes with a resident priest.
2. Constructing convents for those parishes which do not have one. There are currently 535 nuns in charge of catechetical, educational, medical and social ministries throughout this rural diocese.
3. Training a lay catechist for each parish.
4. Recruiting more young men for the seminary.
5. Educating 1,000 very poor or orphan children from remote villages and providing them with free room and board.

The Kumbakonam diocese is trying to realize these goals gradually, depending on the availability of funds. Every year, an average of 40 young men and women go out of this diocese to other missions throughout India and other parts of the world to serve God and His people as missionaries. The mission and spiritual prospects of the Kumbakonam diocese are bright but its needs are pressing. Therefore, your fervent prayers and generous help are earnestly requested for building the Kingdom of God in the diocese of Kumbakonam, India.
